Minneapolis Institute of Art - Free virtual talk on April 28 (6:00 PM) with artist L'Merchie Frazier, who will speak about her intricate and detailed textile work in the special exhibition "*Freedom Rising: I am the Story*," which examines the lives and legacies of people of African-decent, and explores how art can be a powerful vehicle to address equity and justice. May 11, 2021 at 2:00 PM:

From the Minnesota Historical Society, listen to a new documentary, "A Brief History of Women in Bars: A Minnesota Story in Three Rounds," then join us in conversation with its creator. Fulbright-National Geographic Digital Storytelling Fellow, historian, and podcaster Katie Thornton will look at how Minnesota's temperance movement set the stage for our women's suffrage movement. Explore how temperance leaders and many early suffragists failed to engage women who were not wealthy, white, Anglo-Saxon Protestants. Discover how women who did not fit those definitions empowered themselves – sometimes through the economic and social opportunities presented by the alcohol industry. Thornton will also talk about doing historical research at the Gale Family Library.

Minutes - March 22, 2021 AAUW Business Meeting - Hastings Branch (Zoom)

1. Members (36) joined the meeting at 6:30 pm and shared observations on signs of spring. President Lisa Hedin called the meeting to order at 6:46 pm. Her **President's Greeting** included:

- Announcement that membership dues have increased to \$93 for 2021-22.

- Request for two additional voting delegates to the May 1st, AAUW MN annual meeting. Electronic voting will be done 3/31 - 4/17. Jackie Rigelman and Peggy Horsch volunteered.

- Reading to members of the thank-you note from Hastings Reads for the branch's donation in the current year.

- Reminder how important it is for all members to vote on the AAUW National bylaws, especially, the removal of the education requirement for membership, which failed previously, due to lack of a quorum. Voting will open on April 7 and continue until May 17.

2. Secretary. The minutes of the February business meeting were approved as printed in the TWIG. Motion: Betty Hoeschen; Second: Pat Powers.

3. Treasurer. Mary Charlson reported a current checkbook balance through 3/22/21 of \$2,813.60. The Treasurer's report was approved. Motion: Lisa West; Second: Trudy Cragg.

Committee Reports

Membership: Kathy Palmer announced the addition of a new member, Stephanie Malm.

Program: As a teaser for the April 26, "All Things AAUW"meeting", Lisa Hedin shared a vintage photo of a GadAbouts event at Forepaughs in St Paul". Amy Browender will present "College Possible" in May.

Fundraising: A report will be made at the April meeting.

Public Policy: Pat Powers encouraged members to check out the new virtual programs now being made available by MN AAUW of all Minneapolis branch programs, news of which recently was emailed to all members. Gail Glashan offered to assist in supplying updated email addresses to AAUW MN for any members who did not receive the emails. Pat also noted that a resolution on equal access to quality education was recently prepared and submitted by a small group of Board members and accepted by AAUW MN. In future, it is planned to draft resolutions earlier in the program year to allow input and review by all members before submission.

Branch Strategic Plan: Lisa West reported that a stategic plan has been drafted by a group of Board members during two recent Zoom meetings. All Board member comments are requested to Lisa W. by March 26. The Board will review and approve a final draft at the April 5th meeting, which will be presented for final review at the April 26 membership meeting.
