#### **Building Remembrance For Reconciliation (BR4R)**

The first step towards a healthy relationship among all peoples is learning about, speaking, and hearing the truth of our history. In honoring February as Black History Month, AAUW is excited to have as our guest speakers, for our program, members of Building Remembrance for Reconciliation (BR4R). BR4R is a group of Minneapolis and Hastings residents dedicated to learning about and memorializing the history of African American settlers in Hastings, Minnesota.

The presentation will cover the history of early Black settlers in Hastings with a focus on the Wallace and Curry families. Greg McMoore and James Curry are direct descendants of the same ancestor Israel Dungeon and will share the history of their family from Virginia to Minnesota to South Minneapolis.

#### Our speakers:

James Curry Producer, director, writer, editor and educator James Curry has been active in filmmaking for over 30 years. Educated at Full Sail, The American Film Institute and the Minnesota School of Business, he earned his MFA in Film from the Vermont College of Fine Arts. He has worked on numerous projects in Los Angeles and Minneapolis ranging from trailers, commercials and music videos as well as broadcast for NBC, FOX and currently the morning news for KSTP. Clients include documentary work for Prince. His short film Westbound was selected for the 2016 New York Short Film Festival, the Twin Cities Black Film Festival and the Minneapolis Saint Paul International Film Festival. His last documentary Masterjam was the focus of a mental health panel convened at the 2019 Denton Black Film Festival and won Best Documentary at the 2018 Twin Cities Black Film Festival. In 2021 he was awarded the Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship for Film. He continues to teach film and production at Augsburg University. He is one of the founders of BR4R (Building Remembrance for Reconciliation) with whom he is collaborating with its members on documenting two pioneering Black families of Hastings, the Curry and Wallace families of whom he is a descendant.

Heidi Langenfeld Heidi Langenfeld is currently a volunteer at the Pioneer Room in Hastings. Her interest in the history of Blacks in Hastings began in 2006 while researching George Washington Daniels. Daniels was born a slave in Georgia. He served in the Civil War with William LeDuc, who hired him to bring his horses to Hastings in 1865 and worked on the LeDuc farms from 1865 to 1879. Curious whether there were other Blacks in Hastings when George arrived here led Heidi to start a research project that continues today.

Greg McMoore Since the mid 1860's Greg McMoore and his family have called Minnesota home. After graduating from Macalester College, Mr. McMoore continued his studies at Howard and George Washington University in Washington, D.C. Mr. McMoore has trained, developed programming and consulted in the fields of race, class and culture in Minnesota, The U.S. and internationally. Now retired, Greg and his family currently reside in south Minneapolis where his Grandmother Elsie Wallace came as a young woman. His Great Great Grandparents, John and Nancy Wallace lived first in Lakeville, and then moved to Hastings where they raised their children.

Sophia was the recipient of our NCCWSL scholarship for 2020, but because the conference was cancelled due to the pandemic, we extended the scholarship to her, again, for 2021. However, due to the continuation of the pandemic, the conference will only be held virtually this year. Therefore, the \$1000 scholarship that we were planning to use to send our recipient to Washington D.C. is no longer appropriate. This money is in our budget and was a grant from AAUW MN, to be used only for NCCWSL scholarships. Because the conference is virtual, the registration is only \$95. #### Minutes - January 25, 2021 AAUW Meeting - Hastings Branch (Zoom)

- 1. Members (approximately 33) joined the meeting by 6:30 pm and were invited to share their chili tips. President Lisa Hedin called the meeting to order at 6:43 pm. Her greeting emphasized the Spring voting available on the AAUW National website [ aauw.org ], specifically on public policy for the next two years, as well as the education requirement for AAUW membership. She urged members to engage and use these opportunities to express their views.
- **2.** The minutes of the November business meeting were approved as printed in the December TWIG. Motion: Kathy O'Keefe; second: Pat Schultz.
- **3.** The Treasurer's Report (November/December, 2020) was approved as emailed. (Motion: Betty Hoeschen; Second: Glenda Schnirring). Mary Charlson reported a current checkbook balance of \$6,049.13.

#### 4. Committee Reports

*Membership*: Jackie Rigelman reported one new member (Nicole Sindelar).

**Program:** Tina Folch noted that the February presentation will be Building Remembrance for Reconciliation (BR4R), formerly known as Bridges. The 50th Anniversary of the Hastings Branch will be discussed at the February Board meeting, whether or not to plan an in-person event in April. See TWIG for further information on this.

*Fundraising:* Jackie Rigelman reported that her working group on alternative fundraisers has met and will present ideas to the Board at the February meeting. See the TWIG for further information on this also.

**Public Policy:** Pat Powers reiterated the opportunity to vote on AAUW National public policy and bylaw changes before February 5. It was stressed that 5% national membership participation rate is required to pass any change, thus it is important than local branches respond. Pat also noted that AAUW National has joined with like-minded organizations in taking a public stance against the riot in the U.S. Capitol on January 6.

*Gad-Abouts:* Margaret Goderstad and Lisa Hedin announced some new activities for February and March: (1) A virtual tour of the Russian Museum of Art in Minneapolis on February 2, 2pm; (2) a livestreamed concert by the Minnesota Orchestra on March 4, 7pm; (3) additional Coffees and Conversation (more info in TWIG).

**Book Club and Hastings Reads:** Shirley Tammen noted the next Book Club discussion (Zoom) will be on February 8.

AAUW Funds: Glenda Schnirring asked if any members are interested in serving on the selection committee for the annual Hastings High School scholarship award. Kathy O'Keefe expressed interest.

*NCCWSL:* Jan Junkman has written a piece for the *Hastings Journal* on the NCCWSL award(s). The May 25-26 meeting this year will be a virtual meeting with a registration fee of \$95. Therefore, it is hoped that nine additional awards can be made, in addition to the one already committed for Sonja Sanchez. Members are encouraged to make these NCCWSL awards known to eligible college women among their family, friends and acquaintances.

**Community:** Margaret Goderstad noted the Hastings Art Center is again offering Coffee Concerts and reminded members to check the HAS website frequently.

*Diversity:* Lisa Hedin noted the equity focus of the *Hastings Reads* program this year. Also, ISD 200 has developed an equity policy that will receive a first reading at the next meeting of board. The equity policy is available on the ISD 200 website, and members are encouraged to review it.

**5.** Pat Powers moved to adjourn the meeting. Tina Folch seconded. The meeting was adjourned at 7:24 pm.

The evening's presentation followed at 7:30 pm. Margaret Anderson Kelliher spoke to us on how she became involved in Minnesota State Government, her decisions on running for public office, her leadership role as Speaker of the House, and her current position as Commissioner of Transportation. In the question and answer period, members raised the issue of Hastings being a "public transportation desert" and urged Commissioner Kelliher to keep our city in mind as she leads the State's planning for improved public transportation. 




